DRESS & GROOMING REGULATIONS

The following dress code applies to all students and will be enforced at school and at all school functions by all staff members. If a student violates the dress code, the student's parent will be contacted and required to bring a change of clothing or correct the violation. Frequent dress code violations may result in disciplinary action for the student.

- 1. Headwear, hats, caps, stocking caps **will be allowed** at school due to cold weather and sun. All hats and caps must be worn forward. Hoods and hats may be worn in the cafeteria as long as the students face can be seen. It is up to the classroom teacher whether they are allowed in the classroom.
- 2. Sunglasses (except prescription) are not to be worn inside school facilities.
- 3. Shoes must be worn on campus at all school functions. Sandals must have a heel strap. Thongs, flip-flops, or backless shoes are not acceptable. Tennis shoes or other sturdy shoes are recommended because students participate in Physical Education daily.
- 4. Tube tops, halter tops, spaghetti strap tank tops are not to be worn.
- 5. Any see-through clothing or clothing that expose the body in a suggestive manner or draws undue attention to the wearer shall not be worn.
- 6. Dresses, skirts, and shorts are acceptable as long as they extend to the wrist. Sportswear type shorts, bike shorts (spandex), gym shorts, are acceptable.
- 7. Attire which may be used as a weapon may not be worn, including but not limited to steel toed boots, chains, items with spikes or studs, and other items deemed inappropriate by the principal and/or school site council.
- 8. Body piercing (brows, nose, lips, tongue, naval) is not acceptable (exception: religious reasons)
- 9. Earrings are acceptable for ears only and must not dangle or pose a danger by being ripped out.
- 10. Gang related symbols, insignia, or writing is not to be worn. Apparel that present a danger of commission of unlawful acts, violation of school regulations, injury to students or staff, profanity, display of products or slogans which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs or sex, obscene, libelous, slanderous, prejudice, or substantially disrupt the educational process are not to be worn.
- 11. Sports team and college team logos on clothing **are** acceptable —this includes jackets and caps.
